INTRODUCTION

However the concept of social work has well developed over the years and continues to evolve in keeping with changing human and social needs and situations. Social work today does not mean only charity or philanthropy. It has been accorded the significance of a profession like the other helping profession and is practiced in a systematic and methodical manner.

Social work as a profession is being increasingly recognized as a core profession in the process of human and social development. The scope of the human and social services continues to be in keeping with the functioning of the modern welfare state. Professionally trained with qualified Social worker are increasingly being sought for holding responsible positions in the Govt. and Non-Govt. Organization working in the field of individual, family and social development.

Today society has faced with a various issues which come into the fields of professional social work education, training and practices. This required professional social worker to have a sound knowledge and value base conductive attitudes and appropriate skill. So that they are better equipped to enable people to help themselves to manage their situations and lives effectively. Appropriate application of scientific knowledge and skill with sound foundation of values is equally essential in the entire process of social work training education, practice and research.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMME

Master of Social Work (M.S.W.) two year's four semester degree programme:

Specialization:

Community Development:

This specialization equips social work graduates to work as community organizer, supervisors, project officers in community based organization working with the under privileged group in tribal, rural and urban areas. Students are placed in tribal rural & urban setting for field work during academic year. They are expected to have a high level of motivation and develop skill to draw people participation in community work carried out by Government and non-government organization.

Generic

As per multi disciplinary approach this stream of social work trained the students in all fields of social work. This discipline gives knowledge with field work application in the field of family and child welfare, medical and Psychoactive social work, community development,

labor welfare and personal management, crime and correctional social work. So this stream equips social work graduates to work in all fields of social work as a labour officer, professional officer, counselor, superintendent etc. Student are placed in various social welfare agencies for field work during academic year. They are hopes to develop skill and high level creativeness among them.

Field - Work

Field-work is very classic feature and an integral part of PG Degree programme. Field-work enables the students to integrate and reinforce the theroretical Knowledge and information acquired through classroom instruction and develop skill through actual practice under competent supervision from the agency and by the faculty supervisors. Each students is the two year period of training. Every student is regared to put in 15 hours every week of field work in the organization in which he/she is placed for field-work.

The field work component of the MSW course is organized into concurrent field work, Block placement. The college has a very well developed field work programme with a meticulous worked out fieldwork oracular. There is a major trust on joint inputes by faculty and agency supervisor through collaborative relationship with a member of field-work agencies. In additional these issue related camps seminar, conferences, workshop, etc. give enhanced experiences. Apart from the co-concurrent field work the college organizes orientation visit study tour, village camp etc.

Research Project

(M.S.W. IV Semester)

Every faculty shall devote at least 4 Hours per week for research guidance to be give to the students assigned to him/her. The Research dissertation shall carry 100 marks and shall have external Assessment.

The M.S.W. student admitted to the Third Semester shall select research topic in the beginning of the third semester for project work in consultation with the Research Guide. A sample of at least 50 units shall be drawn where the students goes for sampling method.

Every student shall submit three typed and well bound copies of such project report 15 days before the commencement of the Fourth Semester examination. The project report shall carry a total of 100 marks and shall be treated as a separate head of passing. A candidate must obtain minimum 50 marks for passing under this head. The project report at MSW IV Semester Examination should be assessed externally be concerned

examiner appointed by the University. A candidate failing at this head shall submit a research report as prescribed by the University within a period of three months from the date of the results and shall pay applicable fees along with examination form.

Skill Laboratory

Social work education lays great emphasis on developing appropriate skill required for working with the people effectively. This is significance because the professionally trained social worker is one of the important agents of change.

The laboratory experience offered by the college provides organized opportunities and stimulated experience for the trainers to develop necessary understanding skill.

The skill-lab which is a unique feature of the college enables students to develop skill necessary for understanding self communication interviewing application fo audio-visual aids, recording, reporting etc.

Rural Camp

An integral part of the curriculum programme during the IInd semester of MSW degree course is the rural camp / Tribal camp. It provides students with an expose to rural / tribal life, problems and issues related to poverty and development and enables them to place organize & implement programmes. Above all the exercise held student to involve a patterned participative, reflective and analytical learning.

Study Tour/Orientation Visit

An integral part of the curriculum activities orientation visit has organized to study the various aspects of welfare organization and its mechanism. Orientation visit are organize at District place to learn the functionaries of organization (Govt. & NGO's) welfare organization like Jail, Factory, Officers, Various Project, Various renowned NGO's etc. have been visited.

Study tour has organize in the IVth semester out of district for visiting & learn the functionaries of the well reputed and renowned organization.

Block Field Work Placement

After the annual examination of year MSW II year degree course, The student is placed in an organization for a period of 30 days. During this period the students expected to works on item and study all the relevant aspects of the organization and learn to faction as a full-fledged professional social worker. Certificate of satisfactory completion of block field work

placement by the organization is necessary for declaration of the result and obtaining the MSW degree.

Seminar Conference & Workshop

Our college always provides forum for critical discussion, on contempory patterns of development. Few of which such event are seminar, paper reading conferences and workshop.

Faculty members in the college as well as across the colleges conduct Seminars, Conferences, Workshop, Training Programme for student and faculty development.

The programme are organized for develop the skill of learning presentation, application of audio-video, aids, habits of library world withing the students.

The programme were organized in the area of tribal awareness agriculture planning, management, leadership development, human development, gender sensitization, nutrition, Social accountability microplanning, project proposal making, Capacity Building, Curriculum review and development, health, life skill etc.

TARA (Tribal and Rural Awareness Activities)

The TARA was conceptualized by Bhagini Mandal Chopda's College of Social Work in December 1997 to initiate the process of Capacity Building, Awareness Regarding educational, social, health, environmental issues among people of tribal and rural areas and organized various programmes for their upliftment.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Admission Procedure:

1. The candidate must apply only on a prescribed form attached to the prospectus of the Institution. The Prospectus of the College must clearly indicate the reservation of seats as per the Government and University norms, date of entrance test, date of declaration of the selection list and waiting list and the last date of admission. The selected candidate must at the time of admission, procedure all original certificate (SSC, HSC and Graduation, Caste Certificate, Domicile Certificate, Income Certificate, Non-creamy Layer Certificate and other relevant Certificate Documents) and mark-lists. The candidate shall have to pay the full fees as prescribed by the University. The Principal of the College may grant concession at his own discretion. The scholarship holders may totally be exempted from paying the fees save nominal admission fees. Candidates will have to obtain their

transference certificate indicating the College last attended and the Examination last passed. The candidate who have passed their last qualifying Examination from a University other than North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon must submit a migration certificate immediately after securing admission. As per North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon rules every candidate must obtain an eligibility certificate. A student who fails to obtain the eligibility certificate will not be permitted to appear for the Semester IV Examination.

Reservation of Seats:

There will be reservation of seats for the backward class students and the female candidates as per rules of North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon and Government of Maharashtra.

50% of the sanctioned seats shall be reserved for BSW degree holders on merit basis, strict following the rules of reservation for different categories including 10% seats for other universities. The remaining seats shall be filled up according to merit (the percentage of marks at any recognized degree exam + percentage of marks at the Entrance test.) and reservation.

Eligibility:

Graduates of any University recognized by the University Grants Commissions shall be eligible to apply for the MSW degree programme.

Admission Scrutiny:

The Merit list shall be prepared by taking into consideration the percentage of Marks at the graduation and the entrance test conducted by the College or the University as the case may be. The admission procedure shall be transparent and the concerned college shall be solely responsible for complaints about admission if any.

Selection Procedure (Entrance):

After a scrutiny of the application the selected candidates will be called for a written test would be mainly to evaluate the expressiveness, general awareness and basic numerical ability of the candidate. In the interview, question may be asked about the subject studied at the University level. The candidate is also expected to know something about the field of specialization for which he/she has applied. In addition, general knowledge, current affairs and other question may be asked. Only there who prove themselves ahead of the test will get admission. List of selected candidates will be displayed on the college notice board only.

The selected candidates must pay the prescribed fees within

specified days after their admission, failing which their admission will be treated as cancelled.

*N.B. No. once paid fee will not be refundable in any circumstances after admission.

Medium of Instruction:

1. The medium of Instruction shall be English. However, as North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon has allowed students to write examination answer books in Marathi suitable instructions may be given in the regional language i.e. Marathi.

MSW Course Semester Pattern: 60:40 Marks: (From 2014-15)

Each Theory Paper for 100 Marks consists of 60 Marks for university exam and 40 marks for internal assessment. The internal assessment for 40 marks shall be based on marks secured in the test and personal performance of the student.

Discipline:

Students are expected to follow all rules and maintain discipline throughout the course period. Ragging in any form, within or outside the campus, is strictly prohibited. In case a student is found violating the rules of discipline, the Principal of the College shall take strict action against him/her.

Age Limit:

Candidate seeking admission should have completed 20 years of age and must be below 40 years. This rule can be valid under special circumstances also.

Attendance

Grant of Terms:

90 percent attendance at Field Work and class room teaching sessions is required for a student to be eligible for keeping the term. In very exceptional circumstances leave with prior permission of the Principal of the College may be granted with a condition of compensating the loss of educational days within the limit of 40%. The Principal of the college shall have the responsibility of and control over all matters pertaining of discipline and professional behaviour.

The Library:

The Library is well equipped with books on Social Work Rural Welfare & Tribal Welfare etc. The library also subscribes to journals in the field of Social Work and Social Sciences. There is also a Book Bank for which separate provision to annual examination. The students are expected

कर्मवीर भाऊराव पाटील कमवा व शिका योजना :
